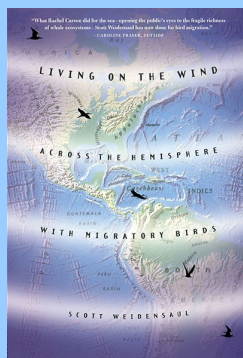

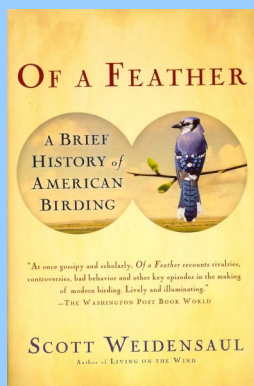
Author and naturalist Scott Weidensaul has written more than two dozen books on natural history, including *Living on the Wind: Across the Hemisphere with Migratory Birds*, a Pulitzer Prize finalist; *The Ghost with Trembling Wings*, about the search for species that may or may not be extinct; and *Of a Feather: A Brief History of American Birding*.

His newest book, *The First Frontier: The Forgotten History of Struggle, Savagery and Endurance in Early America*, has just been published.

Weidensaul lectures widely on wildlife and environmental topics, and is an active field researcher, specializing in birds of prey and hummingbirds. He lives in the Appalachians of eastern Pennsylvania, the heart of the old colonial frontier

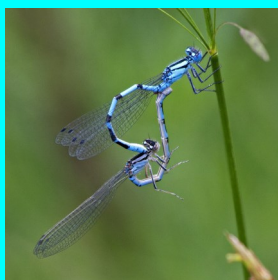

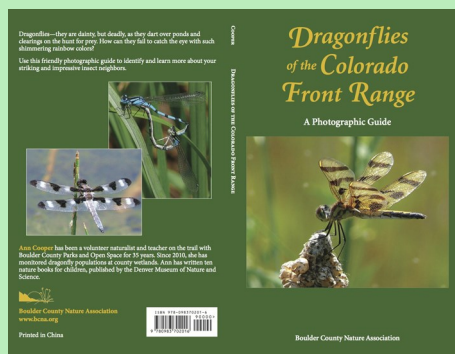
